


Evaluation Results



The Winter Bear Project compiled **256** evaluation responses. (Complete responses from each location are available upon request.)

Of those surveyed:

- 49.5% were under the age of 25
- 75.9 % identified as Alaska Native
- 99% would recommend The Winter Bear to a friend

• 61% of respondents selected a "6" or "7"
